Job Summary:

Work on a collaborative team to provide early intervention services to parents, family members and caregivers with a deaf, deaf-blind, or hard of hearing child, ages birth to six, using an American Sign Language (ASL) & English (or the family's home language) bilingual approach.

Essential Job Functions:

- Provide early intervention services to target child and family outcomes in the family's home (or other natural environment)
- Develop Individual Family Service Plans (IFSPs) with the child's family and Family Resource Coordinator
- Coach families on how to incorporate an ASL & English (or the family's home language) bilingual approach into their daily routines
- Conduct ongoing assessments on child's developmental skills
- Write progress reports
- Maintain paperwork and records on each child on caseload
- Collaborate with other professionals to meet the needs and goals of the family
- Plan and lead center-based child and parent activities
- Work with team to coordinate volunteer support
- Perform other educational or administrative duties as assigned by the department director

Experience/Qualifications:

- Experience with the bilingual ASL-English (or other home language) approach and a willingness to support both languages *required*
- Experience working with young children ages birth to six who are deaf, hard of hearing, or deafblind is preferred
- Native or near native fluency in ASL and knowledge of Deaf culture and community required
- Knowledge of child development required
- Must have personal and reliable transportation to have access to the Tri-County services area (Pierce, King and Snohomish Counties) required
- Valid Driver's License required
- Experience with listening technology (hearing aids, cochlear implants, and FM systems) preferred

- Effective time management, personal organization skills and attention to detail
- Must have basic computer skills, including word processing, familiarity with Microsoft Outlook preferred
- Effective verbal/signed, listening, and written communication preferred

Education/Licenses/Certificates:

- Masters in Deaf Education preferred, MA CCC-SLP, Au.D, and Bachelors of Deaf Education applicants will be considered.
- Washington State teaching certificate, or ability to obtain within three months date of hire
- CPR/First Aid/Blood Bourne Pathogens certification, or willingness to obtain
- Pass state and federal background checks

Physical Demands:

- Must be able to cope with the demands and needs of small children
- Ability to work autonomously with a varied work schedule
- Ability to provide evening services to working families
- Ability to bend, lift and carry objects up to 25 pounds
- Ability to sit for long periods of time and commute through metropolitan traffic/driving conditions
- Physical agility to bend, stoop, walk, reach overhead, push, pull, squat, kneel, crawl, twist and turn
- Ability and willingness to efficiently travel by car throughout King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties
